At the beginning of this 21st century, in June, 2000, by overwhelming majority vote, we, the people of Sint Maarten, asserted our aspiration for self-determination by proclaiming our choice for 'Status Apart' from the Netherlands Antilles.

That was a major milestone on the journey that is to culminate in the proclamation of Country Sint Maarten within the Kingdom of the Netherlands on December 15, 2008.

Our journey to that date with destiny, and the framework for our transition to the new beginning, will be of profound relevance to the way Sint Maarten votes in this year's Election.

On Friday April 20, 2007, we, the people of Sint Maarten, will cast our ballots in the Island Council Elections that will be the most crucial in our history.

On that day, the collective will of the electorate shall decide the Government that will be vested with

responsibility for our transition from Island Territory to Country Sint Maarten, next year.

Come April 21, 2007, we put aside our differences and we go forward together to a new beginning; and to a new world.

Come April 21, 2007, Sint Maarten will have reason to exhale.

On the eve of the Island council Elections, Sint Maarten stands at the threshold of an era of virtually unlimited opportunity.

With this vista of opportunity comes considerable challenge.

The immediate challenge for the people of Sint Maarten is the election of a Government that will bring fresh thinking, clear vision and new capacities to the transition from island territory to self governing country; this disqualifies a Government that is shackled to the special interests it has diligently served over the years, to the manifest neglect of Sint Maarten's grassroots.

Country status within the Kingdom will be much more than a matter of formalizing the constitutional instruments that will transform Sint Maarten into a fully self-governing country, with external security and foreign affairs being Kingdom matters.

Sint Maarteners, and particularly young Sint Maarteners, know that business as usual will not deliver the promise of the new beginning to which we all aspire.

In that context, the people of Sint Maarten took a decisive step last year when they elected two National Alliance candidates to the Parliament of the Netherlands Antilles, against only one candidate from the other parties contesting that Election.

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That result confirmed that it is the collective will of Sint Maarten's sons and daughters those of us who are native born, as well as our adopted brothers and sisters from other lands – to entrust the preparation for Country Sint Maarten to the National Alliance.

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Your renewed mandate for the National Alliance in this year's Elections will be affirmation of your aspirations for a new beginning for our society.

On the road to Country Sint Maarten, the Government you elect on April 20 will have to deal urgently with the endemic neglect and deprivation that is the legacy of the outgoing administration.

Nowhere is that legacy more onerous than in education.

With close to four thousand children born in Sint Maarten since January 1, 2000, together with unknown numbers of undocumented children from other lands coming to live here in that period, the outgoing Government, led by the Commissioner for Education, has failed to build even one school in this century

The school plant is inadequate and classrooms are ill equipped, overcrowded and understaffed.

Teachers are overworked, underpaid, under-trained and denied benefits extended to other public servants.

Sports and leisure space and facilities are markedly inadequate in our school complexes.

At over forty percent at one major institution last year, the failure rate in final examinations is depressing.

The level of alienation within the school population is frightening.

Confrontations between students and teachers have become commonplace.

A frightening one third of young persons between the ages of twelve to twenty four years are considered youth at risk.



Given that the leader of the Government is Commissioner of education, she cannot attempt to avoid responsibility for the appalling state of the schools system.

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The state of our education system is a compelling indictment of the entire administration that is about to demit office.

Our elderly and the otherwise vulnerable are also seriously at risk, with a callous administration essentially leaving them to fend for themselves.

The DP Government has also failed the country in sport, succeeding only in building structures that are little but shells, with inadequate equipment and facilities, and with virtually no coaching programmes to uncover and develop the potential of our promising young athletes.

All of this is the reality in Sint Maarten today, and it provides an instructive index to the performance of the leadership that has been in Government for the last eight years.

The deprivation and neglect are also endemic in other areas.

The unsightly and unacceptable use of The Great Salt Pond for garbage disposal is a continuing environmental outrage as well as a health hazard to Sint Maarteners and to the visitors who keep our economy afloat

Official neglect and indifference to environmental management has placed Simpson Bay Lagoon,

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a major haven for the luxury yachts of the world, at serious risk of rapid degradation.

The existing sanitation, drainage and sewage standards are unacceptable in Philipsburg, capital city designate of Country Sint Maarten, and a Mecca for tourists from around the globehe

Government has no viable programme, and has provided no meaningful funding, for product improvement in this tourism dependent territory.

Despite the predictable flurry of pre-election roadwork, our roads system remains sub-standard, suffocating, stress inducing and inadequate. The outgoing administration has failed to build any social housing in this century; and has done nothing of consequence to contain increases in house rent.

Now, to add insult to injury, the entire society - except for a favoured few - have all been victims in the Government's notorious Belvedere land scam.

Yet, the leader of the Government has issued no rebuke to her Commissioner with responsibility for Housing for his manifest deception in the Belvedere land hoax that has so outraged Sint Maarteners; further evidence that under the incumbent leadership, the ship of state is adrift without a rudder.

Against this dismal backdrop, Sint Maarten is faced with spiraling rises in the cost of living that the Government has done much to ignite, nothing to curb.



Transition to Country SXM

At over forty percent at one major institution last year, the failure rate in final examinations is depressing

The Government elected on April 20th, will have a dual responsibility.

- As a transition Government, it must complete the preparations for Sint Maarten to become country on December 15th, 2008.
- The different agreements already signed must now be implemented and where necessary further negotiations and agreements must be concluded.
- The new Government will inherit sweeping powers and responsibilities that never before belonged to the Government of Sint Maarten.

- The new Government will also have to deal with the needs and prime problems of Sint Maarten.
- Critical areas include, but are not limited to education, youth unemployment, crime, housing, health and traffic.

POLITICAL MANAGEMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT OF COUNTRY SINT MAARTEN

The Island Council of Sint Maarten elected on April 20th, will still comprise 11 members.

The Government will be made up of five Commissioners, of which at the least 3 must be members of the Island Council.



The chairman of the Island Council and Executive Council will still be the Lieutenant Governor.

In new Country Sint Maarten there will be a clear separation of powers.

Members of the Parliament of Sint Maarten cannot at the same time be Ministers.

The Chairman of Parliament will be elected from among the Members of Parliament while the Chairman of the Council of Ministers will be the Prime Minister of Country Sint Maarten.

Sint Maarten will also appoint its own Minister Plenipotentiary in The Hague.

Early in its term, a National Alliance Government will engage in public consultation to decide whether Sint Maarten will have a Parliament of eleven members, as is now the case, or a higher number.

Country Sint Maarten Transition Task Force

After the election storm, a National Alliance Government will call upon all in our society to contribute to preparing for and to building our country as One Sint Maarten

Immediately upon taking National Alliance office. Government will establish COUNTRY SINT MAARTEN TRANSITION TASK FORCE with the remit to submit to the Government, recommendations for capacity building; institutional strengthening; physical infrastructure for new agencies and departments of Government, such as the Department of Justice; and public education and participation in the transition process.

The COUNTRY SINT MARTIN TRANSITION TASK FORCE

will be made up of persons with relevant constitutional, managerial and public affairs expertise, and will be drawn from the wide society, beyond political lines.

The **Transition Task Force** will have the responsibility of establishing a skills data bank in order to identify potential candidates for of Minister and other high offices of state.

In order to gain experience and insight, nominees so identified will be invited to work with the Transition Task Force in the transition phase.



Paradigm Shift

We will of necessity go through a profound paradigm shift in the transition to country Sint Maarten.

The approach to socio-economic matters will from now on be from the perspective of a country and no longer that of an island territory within a country.

Country status brings with it greater authority to deal with matters within the community and greater responsibility.

To facilitate administration a National Alliance will distinguish such matters as follows:

DOOR TO THE REGION AND THE WORLD

In cooperation with the Kingdom, Sint Maarten can now autonomously develop and execute a regional strategy that can be beneficial for our health services, our economy, notably commerce and trade, and facilitate our strategic location as a gateway to the region, combat regional and international crime, and help resolve immigration issues.

We must assume our rightful position in the region and in the wider Caribbean. To protect and strengthen our country, we should participate in all possible regional organisations and institutions.

Immediately upon taking office, a National Alliance Government will establish a COUNTRY SINT MAARTEN TRANSITION TASK FORCE with a remit to submit to the Government. recommendations for capacity building; institutional strengthening; physical infrastructure for new agencies and departments of Government, such as the Department of Justice; and public education and participation in the transition process

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Strong Families

Good To Grow A Plan to Propel Small Business

Within its first 120 days in office, a National Alliance will launch GOOD TO GROW, a project geared to igniting micro and small business enterprises.

GOOD TO GROW will provide funding and training in best practices for small businesses.

GOOD TO GROW is meant to encourage new entrants to business in an economy that favours the powerful with an inside track to senior Government officials.

GOOD TO GROW will be specific to local business ventures unlikely to attract funding in the financial system.

A National Alliance Government will mandate that 25 percent of all government is reserved for qualified micro and small businesses, and will further mandate that payments due from the Government to such businesses are paid promptly, attracting stipulated penalties when overdue.

A National Alliance Government will also mandate that local sub contractors and suppliers be involved in all investment projects involving the Government or requiring Government approval.

An Economy On Auto Pilot

The Sint Maarten economy has long been operating on auto pilot under the present administration. The Government's economic and fiscal policies have been largely a matter of tax collection and outside of this there are no significant measures for relevant skills enhancement; no meaningful new stimulus to micro and small business development and no roadmap to diversification of the Sint Maarten economy

Economic growth is essentially flat and fuelled, essentially, by direct personal taxation with a wide income tax net reaching down to low income earners, who have increasing difficulty making ends meet. Tourism, the key pillar of Sint Maarten's economy, is not supported by coherent or visionary policy planning.

Effective strategies for integrating tourism with local sectors of the economy such as education, training, agriculture fishing and light manufacturing are non existent.

The Government has no viable programme in place for the level of product enhancement that is necessary to enable Sint Maarten to exceed the expectations of our visitors.

The DP is manifestly ill-equipped to manage the new demands of the Country Sint Maarten economy.

We have to rescue the economy from the increasing aimlessness, lack of foresight and guaranteed stagnation of the present Government. The Government's economic and fiscal policies have been largely a matter of tax collection and outside of this there are no significant measures for relevant skills enhancement; no meaningful new stimulus to micro and small business development and no roadmap to diversification of the Sint Maarten economy.

A National Alliance Government will introduce a number of measures to propel the economy on a vibrant and sustainable growth curve anchored to people based outcomes. Taking Tourism To The Next Level

The Sint Maarten economy is rooted in tourism and given our country's abundant natural assets, there is need for evaluation, enhancement and re-branding of the Sint Maarten tourism product.

Our destination needs to redefine itself to and target niche markets, that will include sports tourism, and sophisticated travelers.

The people best qualified to undertake this exercise are the government's industry partners. A National Alliance Government will appoint an action group drawn from tourism leaders and ancillary groups to direct the Sint Maarten re-branding programme.

A National Alliance Government will, in its 45 days in office, establish a TOURISM ADVISORY GROUP, drawn from all components of the travel and tourism trade and charged with formulating a re-branding programme for Sint Maarten.

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The National Alliance's immediate agenda is to:

Make education relevant and accessible to all children

Give our young people reason to hope

Make new social housing a reality and affordable

Clear up congested roads

Stop reckless building without proper planning and regard for the environment

Ease the squeeze on the poor in our society

Make our homes, our workplaces, our streets and our public spaces safe

We can look forward to a day when you will no longer know that you have crossed the border between the Dutch side and the French side of our island by the standard of the roads.
